The 3.75 Day Basic Training Conference provides a comprehensive understanding of the theory of the [SOS Approach](#). It will also teach an in-depth understanding of how children learn to eat and to not eat. General and specific feeding treatment strategies, along with details regarding the assessment of feeding disorders will be covered as well.

BASIC 3.75 DAY TRAINING CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES:

1. Participants will be able to identify the major reasons why children won't eat, as based on learning theory principles.
2. Participants will be able to outline the necessary developmental skills for feeding, and the order of acquisition of those skills across time
3. Participants will be able to list current and historical - physical, behavioral, motor, oral-motor and sensory factors needing examination as part of a feeding assessment.
4. Participants will be able to implement SOS Approach to Feeding Program treatment strategies to be used for toddlers, young children and older children with developmental delays, in Group and Individual treatment formats.

The 4 days will cover :

- Prevalence, what do we know from the Research?
- Feeding Theory - How children learn to and not to eat, Developmental food continuum, Cognitive Development and Psychological Developmental stages.
- Motor Milestones and Oral-Motor Milestones
- Neurosensory and steps to eating
- Assessment of Feeding Problems



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- The SOS Approach to Feeding including Systematic Desensitization and Cues to Eating and use of language.
- Therapy strategies including child and parents
- Building a Food Hierarchy
- Managing Maladaptive Behaviors including Overview, Preventing “problem” behaviors basic intervention strategies –and Emotion Based Discipline
